

Dorado Stars Code of Conduct

Swimmers from the Dorado Stars Swim Club represent themselves, the Club, the sport of swimming and the community where they train. The Club is striving to portray an image that will make us proud of our sport and swimmers. Therefore, all individuals in the Dorado Swim Club will be expected to abide by the following Code of Conduct. The Code of Conduct is in effect for the entire swim season. Everyone signing the Code of Conduct agrees that he / she will abide by it as a representative of the Dorado Swim Club. Infractions of the Code of Conduct may result in disciplinary action

12.1 General

1. Swimmers will not be allowed to drink or carry alcoholic beverages, nor use drugs other than those prescribed by a physician. All such drugs shall be reported to the Coach and Chaperone. This is a zero tolerance policy. Any infraction will result in the swimmer being disciplined.
2. Appropriate behavior is mandatory. When a swimmer`s behavior is deemed as unacceptable by the Coaches and or Chaperones, that swimmer may be disciplined. If this occurs at a competition, the swimmer may be scratched from the meet and sent home at his / her own expense. In extreme cases ,dismissal from the Club may result, should it be deemed necessary in the opinion of the Head Coach and upon Board approval in accordance with Club policies.
3. Orderly and reasonably quiet behavior is expected while representing the Club.

12.2 Competition Travel

1. All team members are expected to respect each individual`s needs for rest, study times and for privacy.
2. Male and female swimmers must have permission from Coaches and Chaperones to be in each others rooms.
3. Swimmers 16 years of age and older ,may be left in their hotel room at the discretion of the Coaches and Chaperones.
4. Curfews ,as determined by Coaches and Chaperones ,are set to ensure proper rest for all swimmers. These must be adhered to at all times. Failure to comply may result in that swimmer being scratched from the meet ,in severe cases sent home at his / her expense.
5. While being billeted, athletes must be on their best behavior at all times. Conditions will not always be ideal and any unreasonable behavior will not be tolerated. Failure to comply will result in that swimmer being scratched from the meet and being sent home at his / her own expense.

12.3 In All Instances

1. Swimmers should consider it their responsibility to report any behavior that does not adhere to the Code of Conduct to the Coaches and the Chaperones.
